It is vital that we never forget the very humble beginning of this great celebration, with the visit by the Angel Gabriel to a young woman in a town called Nazareth in Galilee in The Holy Land, with a message that this young women named Mary would conceive and give birth to the Son of God, who would be called Jesus and would be great (Luke 1, 26-38). This visit from the Angel Gabriel was followed by a time of great trial for Mary and her husband Joseph with a long journey to Joseph's home town while Mary was expecting the birth of her child, only to find there was no room for them to stay anywhere in Bethlehem other than in a stable. So there the child was born and Mary wrapped him in in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger. What followed were visitations from the lowliest and most humble of people, shepherds who came with their flocks and later three wise men who came to give the Son of God gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

As we think about the story of Christmas we think about the work of Brushstrokes, with its humble origin set up to help the needy of Smethwick. Today it is a thriving community project helping refugees and asylum seekers, just like Jesus and his parents would become in their own lives. It gives people hope in times of difficulty and provides them with basic necessities: food, clothing and furniture helping them to be comfortable and sustained in their lives. It works with those who have made the long journey from their homelands to start a new life in Britain. It is a project that helps all people and is welcoming to anyone who comes seeking help. Just like the beauty of Christmas which is a message of love and peace to all, so Brushstrokes is a mission that reaches out to all sharing, love and goodwill to anyone who is in need.

So as we celebrate Christmas this year, let us be glad for all that we have. Let us be thankful for the hope given to us by the work of Brushstrokes and for the peace and love given by God,



by sending his Sin to be born and live among us. May the true meaning of Christmas resonate with us through the love and kindness of all at Brushstrokes in bringing hope in times of difficulty, support in times of need and peace in times of uncertainty.

### Merry Christmas & A. Hppy Mew Year!




